



TGPCA Workshop on Restoring Heritage at Chennai.

One Day workshop was organized for students of Tulsiramji Gaikwad-Patil College of Architecture in association with Public Work Department of Chennai regarding heritage Conservation technique on 11th December 2019 at Chennai. The Public Work Department has taken up restoration of the heritage structure using traditional construction techniques of the 249-year-old Humayun Mahal, one of the iconic buildings in the Chempauk Place complex, facing Wallajah Road, constructed in 1770, the single –storey Indo-Saracenic structure spread over 81,000 sq. ft. The students were taken to the site where Er. Kalyanasundaram, Superintending Engineer, Tamil Nadu public works Department Chempauk, Chennai explained the students about the process of making Mortar Grinding with bullocks used as mortar in heritage structure. Students learned the heritage techniques for conservation and understood the importance Heritage Structure and restoration with teacher Incharge Prof. Atul Lalsare and Prof. Nitesh Jibhkate.
